



## HERMANSEN WOODS

This beautiful 15-acre woodland off the shores of Lake Como was donated to the Conservancy by Al Hermansen in 2000. With hiking trails throughout, it has undergone extensive restoration of native woodland habitat.

### DIRECTIONS:

**From Lake Geneva:** Take Highway 50 west from Lake Geneva. Turn left on South Como Road. The property is 0.3 miles on the left.

**From Fontana:** Take Highway 67 north for 1.75 miles. Turn right to continue east on Highway 67 into Williams Bay. Continue east on Geneva Street to Highway 50. Turn right on Highway 50. In approximately 1 mile, turn left on South Como Road. The property is 0.3 miles on the left.

## HANSEN PRESERVE

W4391 CTH-ES Elkhorn, WI

Hansen Preserve is a scenic 77- acre property along Sugar Creek in the Town of Lafayette. It follows the creek for approximately one half mile to a rare oak opening. The creek meanders through the property on both sides and offers fishing, hiking, canoeing and wildlife viewing

**DIRECTIONS:** Take Highway 12 to County Highway ES north of Elkhorn at the intersection of Abell's Corner. Proceed east on ES to the second bridge where you will see the preserve sign on the south side of the Highway.

## BROMLEY WOODS

W5798 Greening Rd., Whitewater, WI

This 40 acre preserve has a beautiful oak forest and kettle pond. It also offers excellent hiking trails and wildlife viewing.

### DIRECTIONS:

**From Lake Geneva:** Take Highway 12 north for 21 miles and turn right on Highway H in La Grange (at Backyard Bikes). Take another right on Greening Road. The preserve is about a mile up the road on your left.

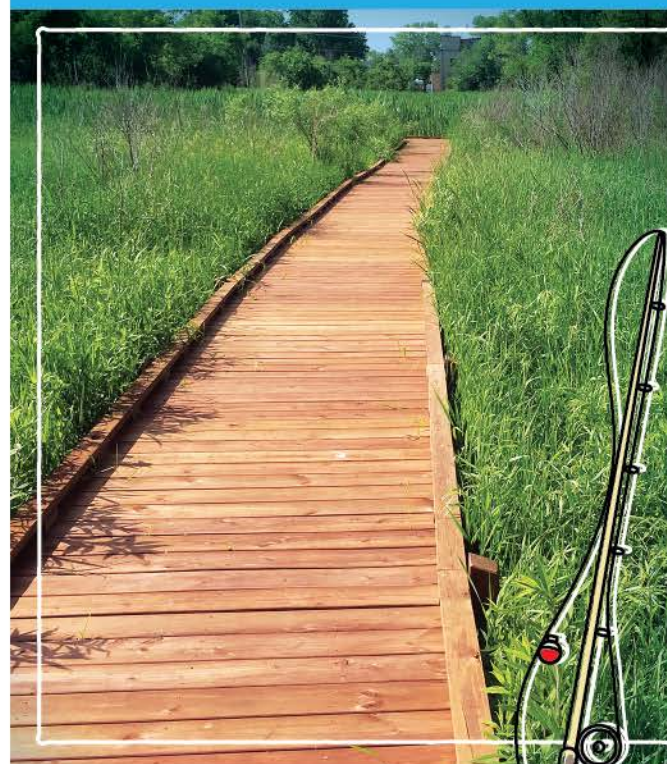

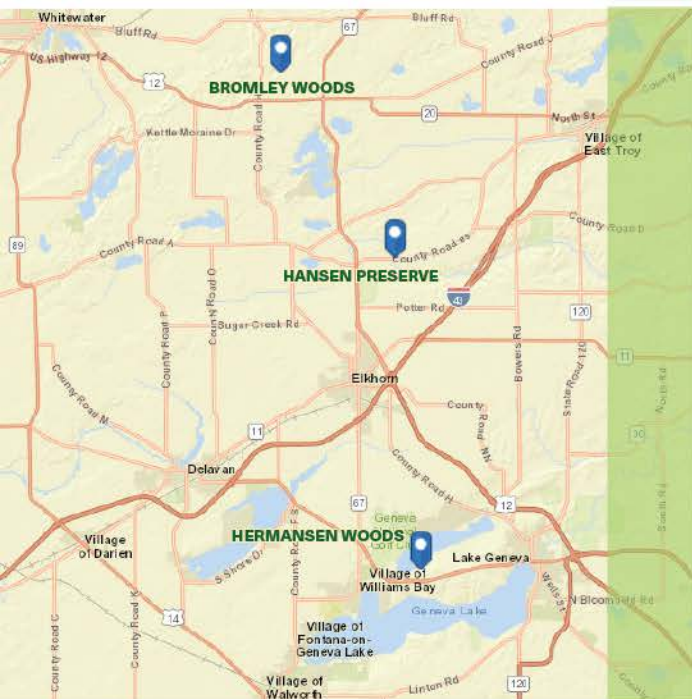

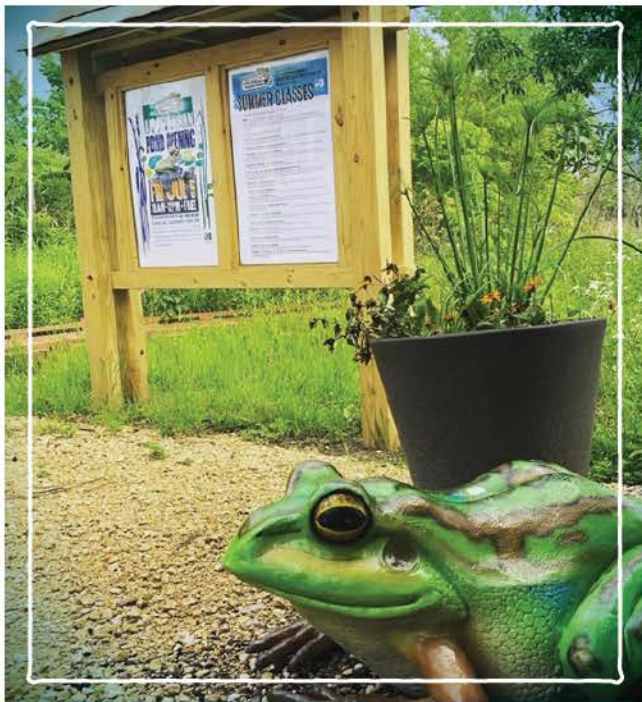

those who want to learn more about nature, there is educational signage, a nature center in the barn and nature classes offered June through August.

The park is adjacent to Kishwaukee Nature Conservancy, which offers miles of trails through restored prairies, oak woodlands and wetlands. The Geneva Lake Conservancy opened the park in June 2018 through a generous donation from Jack Rohner in memory of his late wife, Helen.

### Grab your fishing pole, dig for worms, and drop your line...

in Southwick Creek where brown trout and other small game fish spawn and grow before entering the waters of Geneva Lake. There is a special worm digging area and fishing poles on site, and children under 16 do not need a fishing license.

But fishing isn't all this park has to offer — there is a long boardwalk across a three-acre wetland and an amphibian pond to watch newts and frogs. A Native American trail teaches about native plants and their uses. A story time area known as "The Thinking Spot" encourages children to sit on a log under a walnut tree and watch nature or listen to a story. Children can also play on a natural playground of logs and stones scattered throughout the park. For

#### DIRECTIONS:

**Helen Rohner Children's Fishing Park**  
159 Elkhorn Road, Williams Bay, WI

**From Fontana:** Take Highway 67 to Williams Bay. At the bottom of the hill turn left and follow the highway (which is also called Elkhorn Road) north about a third of a mile. The park's south entrance is on your right. There is parking adjacent to the barn or along Elkhorn Road.

**From Lake Geneva:** Take Highway 50 West to Geneva Street. Follow Geneva Street along the lakefront to the stop sign, which is Elkhorn Road. Turn right and travel 0.3 miles to the park's south entrance. There is parking adjacent to the barn or along Elkhorn Road.
