The Land Trust Accreditation Commission, an independent program of the Land Trust Alliance, conducts an extensive review of each applicant's policies and programs. The Geneva Lake Conservancy believes that renewing its accreditation affirms for its supporters, landowners and others that the Conservancy is committed to following the highest standards of excellence in its ethical and technical operations and is a trusted member of the national land trust community.

The Commission invites public input and accepts signed, written comments on pending applications. Comments must relate to how the Geneva Lake Conservancy complies with national quality standards.
